	Prof. Krishna Iyer informed that the Directives of the		
	Pharmacy Council of India (PCI), states the prescribed	, n	

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












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Rules and Syllabus for B. Pharm course and Scheme and Syllabus for M. Pharm., its letter Ref 14-136/2016-PCI and Ref 14-154/2015 PCI dated December 21, 2016, with the subject heading 'Statutory Scheme/Rules and syllabus for B. Pharm and M. Pharm courses. Thus, it is mandatory to implement the directives of PCI with regard to Rules/Regulations/Syllabus for recognition and extension of approval of B. Pharm and M. Pharm programs of institutes by PCI, and AICTE directives. Therefore, the syllabus for B. Pharm program should be followed as given by PCI.

It is decided to adopt the syllabus of PCI for only First Year B. Pharm students starting from this academic year (2019-2020). The Second, Third and Final Year B. Pharm students will continue with the existing University of Mumbai syllabus. Hence, the Rules and Regulations drafted for First Year B. Pharm program is in concurrence with PCI syllabus and for other Years as per University of Mumbai syllabus (credit-based system).

Prof. Krishna Iyer briefed the contents of Rules & Regulations for the B. Pharm programs. The soft copy was already mailed to all members and the print outs of the same were made available for discussion. He informed that the students will seek admission in BCP via DTE, and as per the Government of Maharashtra, AICTE and PCI rules. The diploma students/lateral entry of students is done by DTE in the second year of B. Pharm (Sem 3).

Dr Sadhana mentioned that ICT does not admit lateral entry of students. Thus, it was decided to send the letter

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












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	to DTE seeking the permission to stop the lateral entry in BCP, since it is now conferred with the 'Autonomous' status. Prof Krishnapriya informed that for this year the	Governing body

	The duration of B. Pharm program is for 4 years comprising of 8 semesters. All odd semesters function from July to December and even semesters from January to May.		
	The contents were comprehensively discussed with pertinent suggestions for implementation of syllabus in achieving program objectives. The committee members approved these Rules &		
	Regulations and suggested few points to append which are mentioned subsequently.		
002.03	To consider Schemes & Syllabus (Sem I and Sem II) both in line with PCI		
	recommendations		
	Attendance The minimum attendance of 80% in every course is mandatory as per PCI Rules & Regulations. The same will be adopted for the First Year B. Pharm students. As per University of Mumbai-The minimum attendance of 75% is mandatory and the same will be followed for the second, third and final year B. Pharm.		
	Remedial subjects & ATKT (PCI Syllabus)-		
	The first-year students who had taken PCM subjects will have to compulsorily take Biology as the remedial subject.		

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












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The first-year students who had taken PCB subjects will have to compulsorily take Mathematics as the remedial subject. According to PCI, the students are eligible to enroll for Sem- 4. They can be allowed to keep the terms (ATKT) of Sem- 1,2, & 3 courses. However, when they enroll for Sem-5, the students need to clear the First-Year courses while ATKT of Second-Year courses is allowed.	
Project work-(Total 100 hrs)	Dr Ashish & Dr Ratnakar
In semester 8 (UOM), the students are required to do project work.	
Dr Ashish and Dr Ratnakar offered to help the students in selection of project topic which would be in line with the current pharma industry needs and interest of the students. They have also recommended to seek help from BCP alumni for executing the project work. The project assignment and evaluation should be done by industry personnel in consultation with the concerned faculty was recommended by the committee. This project work is also included in PCI syllabus.	
It was decided that the students must submit the projects individually, although they have performed the project work in group. While doing the project work, the students must be informed about BCP expectations & groom them to face the placement interviews.

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























